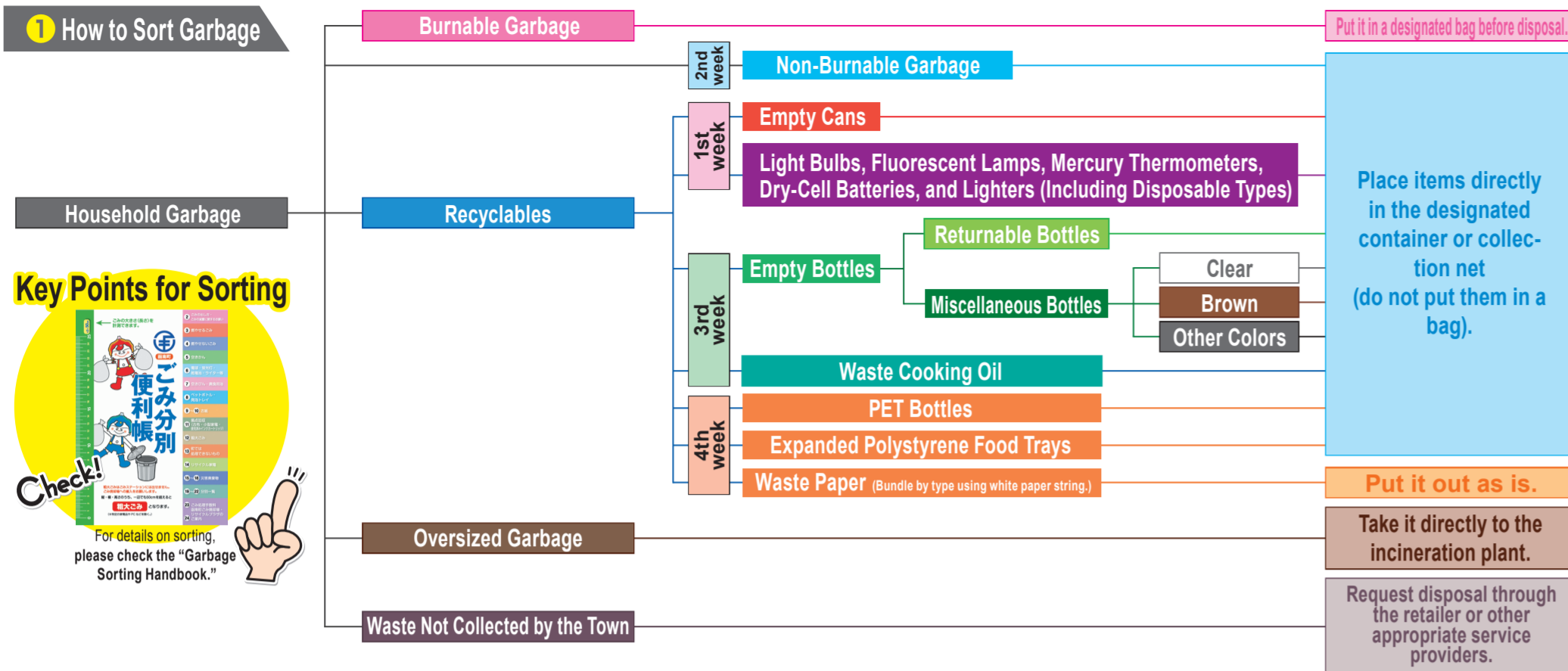

1 How to Sort Garbage



Key Points for Sorting



* Collection is carried out on public holidays as well. * There will be no collection from December 30 through January 3.

[About Burnable Garbage]
Final Collection Dates for 2026: Monday, December 28, 2026 (collection areas on Mondays and Thursdays), Tuesday, December 29, 2026 (collection areas on Tuesdays and Fridays)
Collection Start Dates for 2027: Monday, January 4, 2027 (collection areas on Mondays and Thursdays), Tuesday, January 5, 2027 (collection areas on Tuesdays and Fridays)

[Regarding Garbage Stations]

- Please sort your garbage properly and put it out at the designated location by 8:00 a.m. on the day of collection.
- Please do not illegally dump household waste or litter. (Illegal dumping is punishable by law.)
- Responsibility for managing garbage stations lies with the users. Please sort and dispose of waste properly and responsibly.
- Garbage that is not properly sorted will not be collected and will be marked with a warning sticker. Please check the reason and dispose of it correctly.
- For detailed information on garbage sorting, please refer to the Garbage Sorting Handbook or contact the number listed on the left.

[Regarding the Garbage Incineration Plant]

- Oversized garbage and similar items may be brought to the incineration plant from Monday to Friday between 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m., except from 12:00 p.m. to 1:00 p.m. The plant is closed on Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays.
- On the last Sunday of each month, only household waste will be accepted from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., except from 12:00 p.m. to 1:00 p.m. Please sort your waste properly before bringing it in. Up to 300 kg per day is accepted free of charge. For amounts exceeding 300 kg, an additional fee of 40 yen per 10 kg will be charged.
- When bringing in garbage, you will be asked to verify where the waste was generated and confirm your identity. Please bring identification showing your name and address in Kannami Town (such as a driver's license). If verification cannot be made, the waste will not be accepted.
- In principle, garbage may only be brought in by the person who generated it or by a member of the same household.
- Garbage generated outside Kannami Town or garbage placed in designated bags from other municipalities, will not be accepted under any circumstances.



4 How to Dispose of Burnable Garbage

Items and Disposal Instructions

- [Kitchen Waste]** Drain thoroughly. Food scraps
- [Futons and Carpets]** Bundle to a size within 50 cm. * If any one side exceeds 50 cm, the item will be classified as oversized garbage. Futons
- [Disposable Diapers]** Remove waste (including pet waste). Disposable diapers
- [Others]**
 - Weeds (please remove soil thoroughly before disposal)
 - Expanded polystyrene
 - Cup noodle containers
 - Food trays other than white expanded polystyrene trays
 - Bags and pouches (including aluminum-coated ones)
 - Pet litter and toilet sheets
 - Soft plastic containers, etc.

Pruned Trees and Branches
 Cut to a length of 50 cm or less and a thickness of 10 cm or less, allow to dry, and bundle. The same size requirements apply when bringing items to the garbage incineration plant.
 * Wood generated by dismantling oversized garbage yourself should be disposed of as non-burnable garbage.

5 How to Dispose of Non-Burnable Garbage

Items and Disposal Instructions

- [Metal Items]**
 - Cans other than those listed under "Empty Cans" (such as candy tins and milk cans)
 - Aluminum aerosol cans: Use up the contents completely, puncture the container, and remove the cap.
 - Pots, frying pans, etc.
- [Breakable Items]**
 - Ceramics
 - Glass
 - Cosmetic bottles
 - Bottles used for plium wine and similar items
- [Plastic Products]**
 - Hard plastic containers, etc.
- [Others]**
 - Sharp objects: Wrap the blade in newspaper or similar material.
 - Small home appliances other than those covered by recycling programs: Remove and separate the power cord.

Small home appliances other than those covered by recycling programs
 Kerosene fan heaters and similar items: Be sure to drain all remaining kerosene by turning them upside down or using other methods. Please cooperate with the small electronic appliance recycling collection program at designated collection points.
 * If any one side exceeds 50 cm, the item will be classified as oversized garbage.

6 How to Dispose of Recyclables

Items and Disposal Instructions

- [Beverage Cans and Canned Food Cans]**
 - Rinse and put out without crushing.
 - Cans for canned foods must be within 9 cm in diameter and 15 cm in height.
- [Aerosol Cans and Tabletop Cassette Gas Canisters] (Except Aluminum Products)**
 - To prevent fire accidents, please be sure to use up the contents completely and make a hole in the container and remove the cap. Please perform gas release and puncturing work in a well-ventilated outdoor area.
- [Light Bulbs and Fluorescent Lamps]**
 - Place them directly into the collection container. Broken items are also collected, but please do not break them further and put them out in the original box or similar packaging.
- [Mercury Thermometers]**
 - Please put it out together with its case.
- [Dry-Cell Batteries, etc.]**
 - We collect manganese batteries, alkaline batteries, button batteries, nickel-cadmium batteries, lithium-ion batteries, and mobile batteries.
- [Lighters]**
 - Disposable lighters are also included. Please use up all contents completely.
- [Empty Cans]** (Every 1st)
 - Empty Cans
- [Light Bulbs and Fluorescent Lamps, etc.]** (Every 1st)
 - Light Bulbs and Fluorescent Lamps, etc.
- [Empty Bottles and Waste Cooking Oil]** (Every 3rd)
 - Returnable Bottles: Beer bottles, 1.8-liter sake bottles
 - Clear: Colorless transparent bottles other than returnable bottles
 - Miscellaneous Bottles: Brown bottles other than returnable bottles
 - Other Colors: Bottles that do not fall into any of the three categories on the left
 - Waste Cooking Oil: Remove solid matter (such as tempura crumbs) and place the oil in a PET bottle or the original plastic container. * Solidified oil, animal-based oils, engine oil, and similar items cannot be collected. Place the oil in the designated "Waste Cooking Oil" container.
- [PET Bottles, Expanded Polystyrene Trays, and Used Paper]** (Every 4th)
 - PET Bottles: Only beverage, alcoholic beverage, and soy sauce bottles bearing the PET bottle mark are accepted. All others should be disposed of as burnable garbage. Remove the cap, peel off the label, rinse the container, and place it in the collection net without crushing it. (Caps and labels should be disposed of as burnable garbage.)
 - Expanded Polystyrene Trays: Only white food trays made of expanded polystyrene. Rinse and place in the collection net.
 - Waste Paper: Newspaper (including advertisements and copy paper), Books and magazines (including miscellaneous paper such as snack boxes), Cardboard, Beverage cartons (Items without aluminum coating), Miscellaneous paper. Remove any non-paper items, bundle by type using white paper string, and put them out for collection. Place small items in a paper bag before disposal.

7 Oversized Garbage

Items and Disposal Instructions

- [Furniture]**
- [Bicycles]**
- [Tatami Mats]**
 - Tatami mats must be cut into three pieces.

[Old Cloth] Please wash clothing before placing it in a bag and putting it out. Do not put any items other than clothing in the bag.

[Small Home Appliances] Items with any one side measuring 50 cm or more should be taken directly to the garbage incineration plant.

[Used Ink Cartridge] (Designated collection locations) Kannami Town Hall, Garbage Incineration Plant, Nosonkanyokaizen Center, Seibu Community Center

8 Waste Not Collected by the Town

Items

- [Industrial Waste]** Waste generated from work activities (including home-based piecework), Agricultural vinyl sheets, etc.
- [Hazardous Materials]** LPG cylinders, Batteries, Toxic or Flammable Items, Carbon Dioxide Cartridge
- [Difficult-to-Process Items]** Tires, Fire extinguishers, Waste oil, Motorcycles, Car parts, etc., Concrete, Bricks and roof tiles
- [Appliances Covered by Recycling Programs, etc.]** Refrigerators, Freezers, Washing machines, Clothes dryers, Air conditioners, Televisions, Computers
- [Others]** Soil, stones and sand are not accepted because they are not considered waste.

[Infectious Medical Waste] Regardless of whether the waste comes from a medical facility or home medical care, please consult a medical institution.
